Theme "TOYS, TOYS, TOYS for KIDS without TOYS"

Goal: To make as many toys for donation to groups that distribute them to needy children.

Demonstrations: Five turners will turn four different goblet types in four 3-hour rotations. The first will be a decorative goblet and ball set (a bilboquet). The second task will be to turn a thin stem goblet with at least two captive rings. The third will be to turn a chalice. The fourth will be turner's choice, they will supply their own blank for this demonstration and can make more than one item.

Mini contests: Attendees and featured turners are encouraged to compete in the mini contests. There will be four additional lathes set up for the mini contests as well as an assortment of tools. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own tools. On Friday the goal will be to make as many spin tops as possible by as many turners as are available. Materials will be provided to make tops and to decorate them. Contestants will be given a raffle ticket for each completed top. A drawing will be held to award a \$50 and \$25 prize to top makers. The more tops the more tickets. On Saturday the goal will be to make a simple cup and ball (bilboquet). Predrilled blanks and string and colored balls will be provided. Participants will be given a ticket for each completed bilboquet. A drawing will be held to award a \$50 and \$25 prizes.

Art Show and Toy Contest: All toys made during the mini contests and demonstrations will be on display during the gallery exhibit. At the end of the exhibit the toys will be returned to the groups or clubs that request their return for distribution to children without toys. Unassigned toys will be distributed to groups and clubs that distribute the toys to children without toys. Toys are to be hand-made or decorated, mostly of wood and may be turned, carved, sawn, and must be finished in nontoxic finish.

- 2. PULL TOYS-See Richard Raffan's book "Turning Wooden Toys"
- CARS, TRUCKS, TRAINS-Wheeled toys that may pushed. See Richard Raffan's book "Turning Wooden Toys"
- 4. EDUCATIONAL TOYS
 - A. HAND-EYE COORDINATION TOYS-Cup and ball, kendama, balance platters, 9 pins etc.
 - PUZZLES and GAMES-Pick-up sticks, tic-tac-toe, stacking blocks, checkers, chess, etc.
 - C. COUNTING GAMES-Bowl and acorns, stacking rings, nested cups, etc.
