
"TIPS, TRICKS, TOOLS AND TRADE SECRETS"

A peek preview of our April demonstration

Chris Denson is 25 years old, born and raised in the Fort Worth area. His focus was mostly clay sculpture until he began working at Woodcraft in 2003 and turned his first pen. That's where it all started...

From there he went on to bowls, boxes and hollow forms. As his skills advanced, he began teaching various woodturning classes at the Fort Worth store. He was always fascinated by color, and in 2006 he began airbrushing various paints and dyes on turned pieces.

His work gained interest when two of his Instant Gallery pieces were chosen for the Instant Gallery Critique by a panel of lead demonstrators at SWAT 2007, in Wichita Falls. At SWAT 2008 in Waco, his 2-for-1 raffle piece was one of six that were selected for the Gallery Raffle.

Chris plans to demonstrate some of the techniques he uses in surface finishing.





THIS MONTH'S BIO

My name is Chip Sutherland and I live in North Plano. I've been married 19 yrs (next month) and have 2 daughters: Tori 15 and Molly 13. I grew up on Huntsville, AL, son of a Pediatrician/Allergist. I graduated from Auburn University in 1985 with a Management degree. After working in Atlanta in accounting jobs, I went back to graduate school at Georgia State in 1988 and started working full-time as a software developer in the health care industry. In 1999, I followed a boss from Atlanta to Dallas and relocated the family to Plano. After 22 years in health



care, I am currently working as a Product Manager marketing patient accounting services to hospitals.

I started flat work woodworking about 15 years ago but never progressed due to a job with 50% travel. About 7 years ago, I took a woodturning class at Woodcraft with John Horn but didn't start turning for another 3 years when I bought a Jet 1014 but didn't unpack it for 2 months. After I had turned just 3 small bowls, I got a commission to turn collection bowls for my church. A friend gave me 10 4x 9.75 wide glued-up African mahogany blanks totally maxing out my mini-lathe capacity. After 3 collection bowls, I bought a Jet 1442 on sale and happily completed the rest. Turning wise, I collect beautiful wood awaiting inspiration. I also like free wood and tend to turn things as large as the blank will allow. I lean towards art instead of function so I often embellish my turnings with gilding, inlace, pyrography, dyes and paints. Last year, I took advantage of the Powermatic sale and bought 3520B. I need to sell the 1442 sometime. I have sold the majority of my work because there is only so much you can keep. Plus it helps fund the wood turning addiction. I tend to have at least 5 or 6 different turning projects going at a time so my garage shop is usually disorganized. I rarely throw out a failed piece because I believe it's a matter of time before I figure out how to fix it.



This spring and summer are shaping up to be a very busy and interesting time for woodturners. Checkout the upcoming events on pages 5 and 6 for some of the great things going on. SWAT is in August this year so it is time to start making your best turned object to be included in the instant gallery. It may even be chosen for a critique by the professional demonstrators or for display at AAW headquarters.


Join in and participate in this fun club activity.
