This Month's Demo is... "Multiple Bowls" Using the McNaughton Center Saver System

Presented by Don Hawkins

I am Don Hawkins, a retired realtor and live in Gainesville, Texas with my wife Dixie. When I am not turning wood, we like to travel and I play golf an fish.

Don was introduced to wood turning by a customer about 10 years ago and found it one of the most enjoyable and relaxing things he has ever done. Don enjoys teaching others "what little I know" he says and as we have all experienced, loves to talk about wood turning and showing off. Don enjoys the friendships he has made in the club and looks forward to many more years of making shavings.

For my demo, I plan to show the club what little I have learned about using the McNaughton Center Saver system. I will be coring a couple of large bowl blanks and showing what I have learned to do and what not to do to make the system work. I will also be donating this system to the club in honor of Eddie Charba who loaned me the system and said he never wanted to see it again.

We plan to organize a few more open shop events this year, so if you have an idea for a good theme or you would like to host an open shop, let one of the board members know and we can plan based on your requests.

Be sure to set aside some time during the weekend of April 30 to help at the GTW Arts and Jazz Booth. Each year we make cars from 2 by 4's to give to kids. This is always a fun activity and it provides an opportunity to practice spindle turning while making something that is always greatly appreciated – even if the workmanship is less than perfect. This is also part of our outreach program which lets the community know about us and helps us find new members. Please volunteer to help if you can.

I hope you can make it to the March meeting. Don Hawkins will demonstrate how to use coring tools. Coring tools are used to cut smaller blanks from the center of larger blanks, allowing one to make multiple bowls from just one blank. Don will demonstrate using coring tools which Eddy Charba is donating to the club. You don't want to miss this demo since you will learn how to use a tool that you can borrow to make multiple bowls from one blank.

Don't forget to bring your Empty Bowls and Beads of Courage boxes to the meeting. We just learned that Dallas turned 312 empty bowls for their annual contribution. Why not get a friendly rivalry going and see if we can make 325 this year? Of the 17 members of the Bowl of the Month Club, if five make 24 bowls, five make 18 bowls, and seven make 12 bowls we will have 294 bowls. Then we just need everyone else in the club to bring in at least one bowl each to have a total of 325 bowls! I think this a realistic goal.




Library Update

SWAT 2011 UPDATE

This year, SWAT will be in Waco, Aug 26-28. It is going to be another excellent symposium with many opportunities for woodturners to learn new techniques and see some outstanding demonstrators. The lead demonstrators this year are:

There will also be a number of regional demonstrators doing presentations.

A "must see" area at the symposium is the Instant Gallery. Many woodturners bring items they have turned and it is very impressive how creative these turnings are. Last year there were 529 items in the instant gallery. This year they are increasing the area by 50%, so expect to see a lot more.

There will also be vendors there to give you good deals on tools, wood, and other woodturning items. Last year we had 33 vendors with a total of 60 booths. This year we will have more, so there will be a lot to chose from.

Our club is in charge of the registration booth. We can always use your help if you have a few extra hours. Please let me know if you can volunteer at the registration desk.
