This Month's Demo is... "Pen Making With Kallenshaan Kits"

Presented by Larry Maughan

Like many young boys with an interest in making something out of wood, Larry Maughan would borrow his father's hand tools and make something from a scrap of wood. About 26 years ago he began turning wood with little success. But when he attended the first pen making seminar in the DFW Metroplex, he became hooked on making writing instruments for himself and others to use. He has been making pens, pencils, and other small turnings for nearly 24 years and has watched this craft greatly expand.

The demonstration on May 2 will utilize a pen kit made from several kinds of materials which have been cut and shaped by a laser to illustrate the tools of a woodturner. Larry will demonstrate the assembly of the pieces, gluing, turning, a finishing technique and assembly of the pen mechanism for a kit from Kallenshaan Woods. In completing the demonstration he will give to those attending four pen kits they can take and complete their own Woodturner's pen following the demonstration. Whether a new woodturner or a veteran turner everyone should pick up some new ideas to improve their skills in pen making.







President's Patter

I am writing this a week before the Denton Arts and Jazz Festival. I am looking forward to spending some time at our Arts and Jazz booth turning cars for kids, not just because it is fun to turn cars with friends from the club, but it is always fun to see kids' (and adults') reactions to a car being turned in front of their eyes. Of course, the main reason we as a club participate in Arts and Jazz is to promote woodturning and encourage people to join us. I hope you can support our club by spending some time turning at our booth this year. I think you will enjoy it.

Last month I cored thirteen bowl blanks from four large pieces of Bradford Pear. I soaked them in alcohol and waited approximately forty days for them to dry. Today I turned the first one and I am very pleased with how it came out. Don't forget that the club has a coring system, so you can make multiple bowls from one blank. The coring system will be at the meeting Monday night ready for you to borrow. When you borrow the coring system, you also get an instructional DVD. Also, several members in the club have experience coring bowls, so if you want some help getting started, help is available.

Recall that our club has committed to providing wooden bowls for the Denton Empty Bowl Event in October. The event provides a soup lunch and a hand made bowl for \$20 with the proceeds used to feed the hungry in Denton. Unless my wife tells me otherwise, the bowl I finished today will be an empty bowl which puts me on track to complete at least 30 bowls by October. Whether or not you signed up for the bowl of the month club, I strongly encourage you to turn some nice bowls of any size for this great cause. Let's turn at least 325 bowls for this year's event!

The other community organization we as a club support is Beads of Courage. We are asked to make boxes with diameter at least 6 inches that are given to very ill kids. The kids get a bead for each medical procedure they have to endure and the boxes are used to store the beads. I finally made my first Beads of Courage Box today and I am already starting to design the next one.

Looking ahead, we have some great demonstrations coming up. In May, Larry Maughan will show us how to make interesting pens using the Kallanshan kits. In June, John Solberg will show us how to get our ducks in line using the off center chuck (aka, the "duck chuck") that we are giving away in the quarterly raffle. The third quarter starts out strong in July with a demonstration by Eli Avisera which should be very entertaining and educational. Since the first Monday in July is the 4th, we will postpone our July meeting one day and meet on Tuesday, July 5.












This year, SWAT will be in Waco, Aug 26-28. It is going to be another excellent symposium with many opportunities for woodturners to learn new techniques and see some outstanding demonstrators. The lead demonstrators this year are:

There will also be a number of regional demonstrators doing presentations.

A "must see" area at the symposium is the Instant Gallery. Many woodturners bring items they have turned and it is very impressive how creative these turnings are. Last year there were 529 items in the instant gallery. This year they are increasing the area by 50%, so expect to see a lot more.

There will also be vendors there to give you good deals on tools, wood, and other woodturning items. Last year we had 33 vendors with a total of 60 booths. This year we will have more, so there will be a lot to chose from.
