#### A note about alcohol storage from Tim Howe (972) 539-9659

At the September meeting Don Hawkins made a presentation on turning bowls from green logs. Part of the discussion was the use of methanol to take the moisture out of the wood, and from the audience I heard a few people comment/question the use of plastic drums, and their chemical resistance/safety.

Most drums/ barrels you will find on line are polyethylene, and are typically listed as "water" or "food". The key wording you need to look for is that the material is High-density Polyethylene (HDPE). This is often listed a food grade. Water drums are usually low density polyethylene (LDPE), and will NOT stand up to alcohols, and will leak and fail with time. 10 gallons of methanol on the shop floor is not a good thing.

I got on Ebay and searched plastic drums, and found a used 12 gallon HDPE drum for \$14, originally from some sort of food storage. Shipping cost another \$15, but worth it.

You can buy methanol in 5 gallon cans from either Valley Solvents in Fort Worth (817-831-0001) or Thermo Processes in Dallas (214-942-3131).

I thought this might be something useful to put in the newletter.
