Natural Edge Bowl Demo

I am Don Hawkins and I have been a member of this turning club since 1992. I am a retired realtor and I live in Gainesville with my wife of 47 years, Dixie. I took up turning in 1992 and found out about the club through fellow wood turner and member Bill Macarley.

Robert Voth my turning and demo partner is a retired business man and currently a barber that took up turning in 2008. Robert, a long time friend, wanted me to make him 20 pens for Christmas presents. I told him he should make them and after showing him how, he did just that. He has been hooked ever since and is now a very accomplished turner. Robert also lives in Gainesville with his wife Peggy.

We will be showing you how to make a natural edge bowl. We will start with selecting a log and take you through the entire process to the finished bowl. We will not be doing a lot of turning as most of that will have taken place before the meeting. We will have bowls in various stages of completion to show you how the bowl progresses through the various stages. These bowls are fun to make and can be made with green wood from start to finish without drying the wood. We hope you will enjoy our demonstration and if you have not already done so we hope you will give making a natural edge bowl a try.

Growing up as a son of a carpenter / cabinet maker, I learned first hand, whether I wanted to or not, the value of a plumb line. A standard to be measured against, where deviations from that standard would be obvious and often with accompanying detrimental effects. I believe it to be important to revisit standards for time to time, as a loss of focus can lead to drifting incrementally away from what is true.

As a club I believe we have drifted from our standard as it relates to our program of bring backs. The intended goal is to generate operating funds for the club through the sale of chances to win objects turned by fellow members. It is a chance to acquire and collect workmanship and memories of our fellow club members. It provides the opportunity for the contributing member to share their efforts and talents with someone.

Currently, If a member is fortunate to have purchased several tickets that result in winning multiple bring backs, they are faced with turning a like number of items for the subsequent meeting. Often they are overwhelmed with the obligation of their good fortune.

The board has recognized this apprehension therefore on future drawings if a member receives one or more bring backs, they should only be responsible for a single bring back in the following month. Our members each are at various levels in there turning experience each one should provide your best efforts on a woodturning to share something you were bringing back.

On a safety note we should refrain from bringing pieces of timber as a bring back. Many of your members are new to turning and as such inadequately recognize the dangers associated with wood containing checks and splits. We do not want any of our members to suffer an injury due to wood failing to safely spin on the lathe. If you have timber you want to make available, share it separate from the bring backs being mindful of any structural flaws this might lead to an injury.

To make the bring back program successful, share a keepsake with pride of your best work. True up your participation with other members, share a memory of yourself turning a piece of your work to our Golden Triangle Woodturners bring backs.

Safety Reminder

When I was looking around for a safety reminder for March's newsletter I didn't have to go far. The same day I was thinking about this topic, I working on a small lidded box that I started the week before.

It was spalted maple with a couple of bug holes in it. I had turned it the week before to a rough size which was close to the final dimensions. I then filled the holes with some colored epoxy and left it to dry for a while. I finally had some time to go out to the shop and turn. I started on the box when BANG! It came apart with out warning. The first and biggest piece hit me square between the eyes. Fortunately I had my face shield on and it protected me. I had carefully inspected the wood before turning and saw no cracks. Sometimes in my turning when I get this close to finish I just use safety glasses. All I was doing was cleaning up the epoxy and putting a final finish cut on the piece. It happens so fast. I just want to remind everyone that there are no exceptions. Wear the mask. You never know. See picture below of box.
