Wood of the Month



Honey Mesquite



Honey Mesquite is a prize for Woodturners especially those that do segmenting due to its exceptional stability. It has little movement so is unlikely to crack. It typically has straight to wavy grain though is known for knots and defects which lend to its unique and beautiful look. It glues, turns, and finishes well with a reddish brown heartwood that darkens as it ages. It has a medium to coarse texture as well as open pores. It is also well known for smoking meats which is a great way to use up scraps!


