It was a slow process reading books, watching videos until I discovered Golden Triangle Wood turners. This was the turning point in my learning process, attending meetings, going to open shops, and utilizing the mentoring program. SWAT was another source of my learning, and tool buying.

About five years ago, I took a three-day class from Trent Bosch in his studio in Colorado. During this class I developed my interest in hollow forms. I soon began buying many different hollow form tools. Certainly, I did not need them all, but I just thought that one more tool would make me a better turner. This did not come to realization.

A few years ago, Mike Mahoney did a demo at SWAT on making urns, and I attended. This seemed interesting, but I never put the skills to use until about a year later, when I made an urn for our grand dog Merlin.

My demo will be using the skills I learned from John, Trent and Mike. I will turn an end grain hollow form using HSS tools. The urn will be for a small pet, but the concept can be used for any size pet, or loved one. I will be using some of my favorite hollowing tools, but I will show others that can be used as well, I will also discuss shapes, woods to use, wet or dry wood, and just basic ideas that can be used. A quick formula for sizing will be briefly discussed that you can use on any size urn.



We have to reply on the size of the clamp, or try to put two or three together to hold larger rings. That does not work very well. Sam's jig eliminates all of that! 
